More than 2500 have enrolled in its small business training classes and workshops. The organization was known for its microenterprise training program that assisted in the development of both startup and existing small businesses. Program participants gained skills in small business management, business planning, business model design, presentation skills and more.



You already know that you can build a business selling collectibles on eBay or ebooks on Amazon, but those are just a couple of the options out there for selling products and services online. From virtual services to physical products that use your own unique designs, check out these suggestions for things to sell online that you may not have considered before.

Website Domain

When you purchase the domain for a website, you own it. That means you also have the right to sell it. Whether you've purchased a domain that you no longer use or want to build a business around this type of product, you can display a message on your home page listing the domain for sale and then use marketplaces like Flippa or Sedo to find potential buyers.

Website Templates

To help people create beautiful websites, anyone with some coding or programming knowledge can create customizable templates for WordPress or Squarespace and then offer them for sale. You can sell them on dedicated marketplaces like WP Shop or Etsy.

Apps

For those who can develop desktop or mobile apps, you can sell those in the Apple Store, Google Play, or specific platform marketplaces like Salesforce or Shopify.

Images

Photographers, turn your photos into passive income by making them available on sites like Shutterstock or 500px, where bloggers or online businesses can purchase your images for a small fee.

Music

People who create video or audio content could often use some music or sound effects to enhance their own content. So musicians or sound effect artists can sell the rights to songs or similar content on sites like Royalty Exchange or AudioJungle.





Similarly, companies may need video footage for presentations or to enhance their own video marketing. Some stock photo sites like Shutterstock also offer a marketplace for video content, and there are also video-specific sites like VideoHive and Motion Array.

Courses

If you have expertise in a specific area, you can essentially sell your knowledge to others by creating a course using sites like Udemy or SkillShare. Teach anything from cross stitching to setting up a new computer.

Printable Workbooks

Another way to share your expertise is to create printable workbooks by designing downloadable PDF files. Then you can upload them to your own ecommerce site and deliver them to your customers via email or direct download on the sales page. You can also use marketplaces like PayLoads and SendOwl to sell digital downloads.

Consultations

If you prefer a more one-on-one approach, you can offer in-person or virtual consultations with clients on a variety of subjects. Use a scheduling tool like Acuity or Calendly so customers can book blocks of time with you. Then use that time to help them design their home, provide business advice, or provide whatever type of guidance falls within your niche.

Meal or Workout Plans

Especially when it comes to health and wellness, people can often use a general guide to help them create their own positive habits. If you have experience as a personal trainer or nutritionist, you could create customized meal or workout plans for people looking to make those changes. Real Plans and Trainerize are two sites that allow you to sell customized meal plans.

Access to Events

People are always looking to attend special events. Sell tickets to concerts or other in-

person events on marketplaces like StubHub Vivd Seating, or sell access to your own virtual webinars or events using a virtual platform like AnyMeeting or Skype.

Memberships

If you create a part of your website that's extra valuable, you can sell access to it on a membership basis. Podia and Memberful are a few options for selling memberships to customers.

T-Shirt Designs

You don't need to physically sell t-shirts in order to make money. You can create designs and upload them to sites like Redbubble or Merch and they'll create the actual products.

Printable Artwork

Another option for artists or designers: turn your artwork into downloadable PDF files and then list it for sale, either on your own site or marketplaces like Zazzle or Society6.

Templates

To help others on a more product based level, sell templates for blog posts, speeches or even website disclaimers. Offer them as printables or downloadable PDFs. Theme Forest and Template Cloud both offer a number of options for offering these types of products.

Research Reports

For those who are able to perform professional research, compile your findings into a report and then offer it as a downloadable ebook or guide. You can also gain visibility for your reports on sites like RnR Market Research or Savio.

Photo Filters

For those with photo editing experience, you can create Photoshop or Lightroom actions and then offer them for sale on FilterGrade or Etsy.


