With hard work and determination, Shawn was invited to transfer to Indiana University to continue his studies and his game. Finally, his grandest dreams came true when he was drafted to the NFL as the third pick in the fourth round for the Rams.



Shawn was on top of the world, enjoying all the fruits of his labor—the fame, the fortune, the prestige—until his foundation crumbled under him after a major injury. At this lowest point in his life, he turned to God and asked Jesus into his life—he hasn't been the same since! The Lord even restored him to football; he went on to play with two more NFL teams and had several seasons with NFL Europe.

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

## Beatty Highlights \$7 Million+ Headed to Central Ohio

Ohio's Third Congressional District has received more than \$34 million in federal funds this month alone.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) recently awarded grants totaling more than \$7 million to Ohio's Third Congressional District. U.S. Congresswoman Joyce Beatty (OH-03) issued the following statement in response:

"These announcements are welcome news for my constituents. Funds will be used to invest in Columbus' Southside, assist homeless youth, improve social services for our most vulnerable neighbors, and ensure safe, lead-free housing for children. As a supporter of these HUD and HHS initiatives, I promise to continue to



Specifically, HUD gave the City of Columbus \$5.6 million to identify and eliminate lead-based hazards for low-income families with children under the age of six. HHS allotted over \$900,000 to The Ohio State University to fuel groundbreaking medical research and a \$400,000 grant to better coordinate the delivery of social services for at-risk Central Ohioans. HHS also announced \$800,000 in funds to stimulate job growth in Columbus' Southside and \$200,000 to support homeless youth and runaways.

Throughout Beatty's time in Congress, she has been a stalwart champion of HHS, as well as HUD, and has worked across the aisle to increase funding for young people and families who do not know where they will sleep at night. To date, Beatty has secured \$40 million for the Family Unification Program—a national initiative to prevent family separation due to homelessness among foster care aging-out youth—and another \$6.07 million for the City of Columbus's Community Shelter Board to tackle area youth homelessness.

Remembering names can be a nightmare, especially when you have met someone multiple times! I am going to show you how to never forget a



name again. Researchers from Emory University attempted to improve people's name retention and recall over three sessions. In the first session, each participant took a face recall test to establish their baseline ability. In the following sessions, each participant was taught a memory strategy. After only a month, the participants significantly improved their recall ability, some up to 69 percent!

Here's what they learned. Attach a visual cue to a unique facial or body feature. This memory strategy comes from the EON-Mem (Ecologically Oriented Neurorehabilitation of Memory) program. Here is an example: This is my friend Lacy. If I met her at a party, I would think her hair looks just like an Ace with the pointed A top. Ace = L-Ace-Y (




