NIL Deals are Here

The game has changed. As of July 1, 2021, any student athlete enrolled in Ohio colleges and universities is allowed to earn compensation from their name, image, and likeness ("NIL").

Pursuant to S.B. 187 and Executive Order 2021 -10D, students in Ohio are allowed to obtain professional representation in relation to contracts or legal matters regarding opportunities to earn compensation for use of the student's name, image, or likeness. They will be required to inform their college or university of any contracts they enter. The law and executive order also prohibit those colleges or universities from preventing a student from participating in athletics or otherwise punishing them as a result of earning such compensation.

So, what does that all mean?

First, it means "education, education, educa-

Beginning in high school, students, student-athletes, parents, families, and friends should consider learning 1) the rules related to name, image, and likeness, 2) about brands, 3) about business, 4) what is a complete LLC, 5) what is professional representation, 6) why does one need legal representation, 7) what is a contract, and 8) what are NIL Deals (i.e. opportunities to be compensated for use of the student's name, image, or likeness).

> Second, it means that students who know how to code software, develop websites, write stories, draw art, build social media personas, create digital designs, record and edit videos, perform and produce music, choreograph a dance, bring people together, mobilize people for a cause, and more, can establish businesses and help to build the NIL Deal ecosystem and be compensated as well.

Third, it means that students, studentathletes, families, professional advisors, businesses, colleges, and communities must think and act strategically to minimize harmful exploitation and to maximize the positive oppor-

Coach Rome makes his CSU Coaching Debut

The game features a CSU-KSU rivalry dating back to 1947 with CSU leading the all-time series, 36 -23-1.

Due to the global pandemic, Central State did not participate in athletic competition during the 2019-2020 season. CSU Director of Athletics Tara A. Owens expressed gratitude and excitement about Central State's return to the field in August.

"We have been anxiously waiting for the day when we can safely return to competition," Owens says. "With a new staff led by head coach Bobby Rome and a roster full of re-energized and motivated student-athletes, we can't wait to represent and showcase Central State University at the Classic for Columbus."

Rome II, who was named Central State's head coach in February of 2020, will make his CSU coaching debut on August 28.

"It is an exciting time for Central State football. We have spent the time away from the field recruiting and developing talented and versatile players who possess championship mentalities and unmatched passion for the game of football," Rome says. "The Classic for Columbus is a great opportunity for us to return to action in a world-class venue. Central State is a program and a university that's on the rise and we look forward to kicking off our season on August 28th in Ohio Stadium."

Senior linebacker Kailen Abrams, a two-time Don Hansen All-America selection, echoed his new coach's excitement for the upcoming season.

"We are all ready to be back out on that field again," Abrams says. "It has been difficult being away from the game. We have all made sacrifices and persevered to get to this point and I am thankful for the opportunity to finally be able to compete and play alongside my teammates."

The Kentucky State Thorobreds will take on rival Central State in the inaugural Classic for Columbus on Saturday, August 28 at 2:30 p.m. inside Ohio Stadium in Columbus, Ohio.

"The opportunity to play here at the Shoe is a lifetime opportunity; everyone doesn't get that opportunity and for our student-athletes to partake in an event of this magnitude is absolutely phenomenal." Interim Athletic Director Ramon Johnson told local press at the Classic for Columbus press conference.

Kentucky State Has Two Selected First Team Preseason All-SIAC

The Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference named Anthony Geter and Brett Sylve to the 2021 All-SIAC Preseason First Team during the 2021 SIAC Football Media Day.

Sylve led the Thorobreds in 2019 with 1110 rushing yards, nine touchdowns, and averaged 109.30 yards per game. He had a season-long rush of 52 yards and earned one receiving touch-down.

Geter was a pivotal piece of the Kentucky State offensive line, by helping hold down the offensive side of the ball that allowed the Thorobred offense to rush for a total of 1764 yards and kept the defense away from the quarterback allowing only 11 sacks for the entire season.

Kentucky was picked to finish third in the SIAC Western Division behind #2 Tuskegee and #1 Miles.


