Introduction Our Mission: Empowering People. Saving Wildlife.

The Columbus Zoo and Aquarium Association (CZA) is a 501 (c) (3) not-for-profit organization that manages and operates a highly acclaimed zoo, a golf course, and an LLC waterpark on 612 adjacent acres of land on the northwestern outskirts of Columbus, Ohio.

The Columbus Zoological Park Association, Inc. was organized in 1930 as a not-for-profit corporation. The functions of the Association are to make the public more aware of conservation issues, education programs and recreational opportunities, to encourage civic involvement in the Zoo, to raise funds for the acquisition of animals and to plan Zoo improvements.

Project Background and Goal

The Columbus Zoo and Aquarium's priority is the welfare of our animal collection. In 2023 the CZA relocated our rhinoceros to another facility and anticipates expanding our elephant herd. This project will be to modify the existing rhinoceros' habitat on the south side of the pachyderm facilities and to renovate the habitat to house elephants. The project must also coordinate with adjacent construction for the North America Trek project. The project will include survey work as needed, utilities, new steel post/cable barrier, site grading and so forth.

The CZA has developed a project program and concept plan for consideration. The selected Design Build Contractor will be responsible for all materials and labor to complete the work.

Project Summary

The Elephant South Yard Expansion consists finalizing the concept for the new habitat. Regrading the old rhino yard to level the yard more appropriately for elephants, removal of various concrete wall sections to be included. The steel post and cable fencing system will need to be removed and refabricated to contain elephants, with posts approximately 10' high and a 4-cable system and horizontal steel pipe around the perimeter. We are interested in gaining as much space for the elephants as possible, so we would like to consider relocating the existing concrete public pathway, in addition to removing an existing rhino shade structure. The main pool for the rhino can be modified to contain sand for a dry dust bath area for the elephants, or modified to become a type of splash pad for animal enrichment . Additional shade posts, feeding nets and enrichment panels will also be included in the project and may just need to be relocated versus new design.

Many of the elements such as post/cable are already detailed out in various architectural drawings and can be used in this application.



Scope of Work

The successful contractor will be responsible for all Scope of Work as defined in the attached Contract, and as described in the RFP and other attachments, if applicable.

Supply all design services, equipment and labor to:

- Provide a concept sketch of how far the yard can be extended given the current footprint and public space, for final scope approval.
- Remove existing bollards/cables in the rhino yard and recycle all metals. All cable and hardware such as turnbuckles should be reused if possible.
- Fabricate new bollards/cable and associated footers around exterior of the current habitat of appropriate size for elephant containment. Utilize existing drawing detail on bollards/cables and quantities and construction techniques but replace the horizontal rail with additional cable. Verify all information per on site review. All bollards to be painted or powder coated, and all welds to have rust prevention material applied.
- Re-grade the habitat for proper drainage and level the yard. Remove all materials such as significant sized rock (greater than 3") and other non-suitable materials. Consider leaving the existing retaining walls on the west side in place.
- Add new substrate (soil/grit or other) to the yard to level the yard as needed.
- Remove wood bollards around existing trees and dispose of posts. Leave wood posts near the building.
- Create a new water bowl, leaving the existing concrete water bowl trough. Plumb water to the new water bowl and ensure proper shut off for winter to the plumbing.
- Install (3) existing galvanized mesh panels of varying sizes on the fence structure (to be removed by separate contractor) and reinstall at a location TBD. Mesh is 2x2, approximately 3" or 4" gauge and approximately 8' high x 10' wide.
- Remove existing wood shade structure and roof/gutters at public viewing area, eliminate structure posts. Remove speakers and all associated wiring.
- Add shade sail and attach to existing metal posts. Modify the wood post in the yard or add new steel post at appropriate height in yard for a higher shade placement at that location. Add Alternate: Design/install a permanent roof system instead of removable shade sail.
- Fabricate new mesh panel/post system at elephant touch area height of containment panels to be a minimum of 10'. Small mesh doors hinged on the public side to be incorporated, doors to be latch-able with the ability to be locked, and doors to be approximately 12" x 12" to be added for enrichment which can be opened by the keeper from the "public" side.




- Demo the existing themed concrete rock barrier along the east side of the habitat to 12" below grade, and fill voids with compacted sand fill. Ensure no metal or other sharp hazards exist prior to filling the voids.
- Remove and repair concrete on face of building as needed including carving to match existing and paint concrete as appropriate.
- Demo concrete at existing elephant door and repair concrete as needed in similar style/color.
- Paint elephant door and two existing rhino doors on exhibit side for an updated look.
- Eliminate existing public concrete path in select areas and repour to redirect the path. If we can extend the elephant yard to the concrete path or further, then we will need to determine if the yard is viewable from one location instead of along the entire west face.
- Remove the existing public fence accordingly, install new public fence and repair fence in various locations.
- Repaint existing steel posts that hold the shade structure as needed.
- Paint/powder coat all posts to prevent rust.
- Along adjacent region (North America), design/install a wood fence to prevent a view from the adjacent region. Wood fence would consist of posts at ~12' high and an estimated ~10" diameter. The fence will be a visual barrier for the elephant, but this location will still need the post and cable barrier.
- Install heavy duty turnbuckle to tie down a tire enrichment element. Turnbuckle hardware will be reclaimed by a separate contractor from a previous exhibit.
- Repair any existing public concrete pathways if they are showing heaving or have other damage.
- Install a hay feeder net/arm/motor and protection bar. Similar systems are currently on site in another location to be reviewed.
- Contractor shall be responsible for all dust abatement, sound control, and protection of existing spaces for both the animals and public.
- The building is an active Elephant holding area so Contractor must adhere to all safety procedures of the Zoo.
